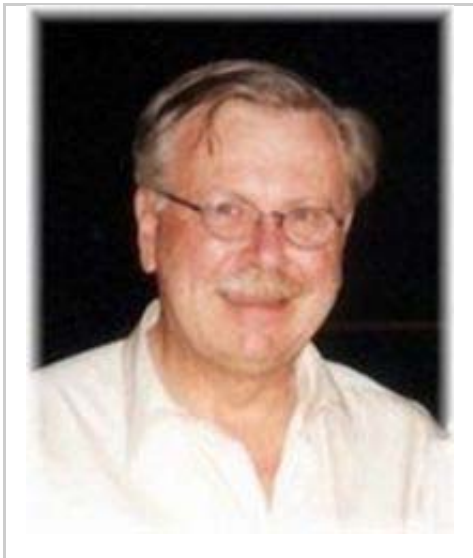

Zenon Walter Losin, Zen age 56 of Grand Blanc formerly of Southfield and Detroit, died Friday, August 17, 2007 at his home.

Zen was born January 21, 1951 in Highland Park, Michigan the son of Irene (nee: Marusa) Losin and the late Zenon Stephen Losin. Also surviving is his beloved brother Bob, and many loving family members and friends.

Zen was raised in Center Line and Detroit and attended Cass Technical High School and graduated from Osborn High School in Detroit, class of 1969. After high school Zen was very interested in electronics. He worked many different jobs related to radio, television, and music production, especially during the disco era.

Also Zen could fix and repair old pipe organs. He and his brother repaired the old Holy Name Catholic Church pipe organ.

Zen also worked for Channel 7 as an engineer, Channel 50 as an engineer, and eventually rose to the level of assistant chief engineer at Channel 62 UPN 50. Zen decided it was time for a move and transferred to the local Fox affiliate in Flint and lived in Grand Blanc. When downsizing occurred at the station Zen decided to open his own video transfer and reproduction business, Walter Media Works, focusing on television station reproduction work, and digital archive solutions.

Zen was an extremely intelligent and enjoyed, local Detroit history, and Internet forums. Zen will be extremely missed by all who counted on his humor and technical abilities.
